Existing or Potential Amenity	Importance (High-Med-Low)	Ideas for Improvement
Playground	Low: 1 Medium: 5 High: 11	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Nature-oriented elements e.g. bears, tree-roots, etc ○ Anything for kids, families, etc ○ Safety and liability issues ○ Need more interactive and equipment that crosses purposes/availability to special needs; think of Arrowhead Park improvements ○ ADA accessible – exceed standards ○ Special population input is needed ○ Ask the kids what they desire ○ Seesaw, big slide, new equipment would be great ○ More things to do for all ages ○ Update playground! ○ ADA
Walkways/Trails/ Connections to Schools, etc.	Low: 1 Medium: 5 High: 12	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Trail linkages to neighborhoods and other trails very desirable for EPRD residents ○ Connections to main street ○ Driveways and parking lots need to be fixed ○ Better grading and decide whether or not paved needs to be accessible to all ○ Wilmot Preschool, Wilmot Elementary School, Evergreen High School; definitely link Alderfer/3 Sisters eventually ○ Smooth accessible walkways ○ Perfect location and setting for walking, a year-round activity too; can be near other activities ○ Have fun, windy, slightly hilly, concrete trail/loop for walking, bikes, rollerblading, etc ○ Easy access for general community – limit excluding disabled persons and their families ○ ADA
Tennis Facility	Low: 2 Medium: 4 High: 9	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Improve what we have ○ We're losing outdoor courts in Evergreen. The high school tennis team really needs more tennis courts (hopefully 6 courts) with lighting to extend the use ○ Need lights, lights, lights – pathway up the hill so you can view the courts from above ○ Improve tennis courts' nets, straps, fences; Marshdale needs straps – broken ○ High according to demonstrated demand; Lighting! ○ Improve existing facilities but don't add to tennis courts ○ Smoother ground, more benches for seating ○ May be losing tennis bubble so high school team needs courts; Evergreen needs more tennis courts with lighting ○ Lighting! ○ Lighting – have tennis and skate park share lighting ○ Lighting for tennis courts, but consider light pollution

Skate Park	Low: 1 Medium: 4 High: 12	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Update what we have ○ Full concrete is expensive, but at least repair ○ This use is great for teens ○ Needed in Evergreen, lots of use and demand ○ Poured in place concrete! ○ ADA accessible would be really unique; medium sized bowl and street course! ○ Needs MAJOR improvements but phase them ○ Lights, Team Pain pouring concrete, more spacious, more obstacles, new location (due to snowmelts) ○ New park, new location in sun or at least covered, lighting added and repair all ramps ○ Concrete, more accessible for all groups of people ○ Made from concrete, lighting some coverage ○ It is possible to receive help from local businesses and grants for concrete building! ○ Concrete skate park with partial/full coverage and/or lights
Accessibility to site	Low: 3 Medium: 3 High: 10	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Access from parking lot is awful; uninviting and difficult ○ View walkways ○ Local residents with disabilities should have input on this; I think walking trail should be accessible and tennis viewing area ○ More parking, more walkways ○ Road to top flat area ○ Gateways and paths to areas ○ Revise traffic flow around recreation center ○ ADA
Undeveloped Areas (Potential for zip line, mountain bike course, summer camps, etc.)	Low: 3 Medium: 7 High: 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Yes, exciting new activities will draw more socialization and interest from all ages ○ Re tree top walk – don't know if it will hold interest over the years ○ Some great ideas – let's pick ones that are unique, like tree top walk and will hold interest for years to come ○ Disc golf ○ A lot of bike paths already around Evergreen ○ More activities for children and teens ○ Zip-line – dangerous (liability) ○ Mountain biking course – go to Alderfer or Elk Meadow ○ Zipline/Ropes – yes! ○ Improvement needed, but lower in priority ○ For the youth ○ A zipline would be so much fun for local kids; basketball court also is a big need in the area → gives our teens something to do ○ Mountain bike team could use a mountain like this; zipline would be awesome! ○ If space is open and budget exists, natural use like ropes course and adventure learning
Disc (Frisbee) Golf	Low: 6 Medium: 4 High: 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Good idea; easy to include and build ○ 9-hole course, work with DMP for space ○ can use be determined? ○ More holes (18) as we only have 2 ○ Very fun, but not in high demand

Existing sand volley ball court (potential for re-purposing)	Low: 6 Medium: 2 High: 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Let's examine how much it is used before "re-purposing" ○ Skate park ○ This seems to be popular ○ Can use be determined? ○ Low: It seems fine ○ Sand court is hard to maintain in undeveloped mountainside venue; repurpose space ○ Not used now
Potential Pavilion/Shelter	Low: 1 Medium: 3 High: 12	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Love the ideas that include firepit; maybe include outdoor kitchen ○ Firepit; design utilizing trees ○ Multiple shelters would be good for all uses and activities ○ Provide shade and shelter from sun and rain ○ More complete use of park ○ Much larger with benches (seating), bbq pits ○ Great log pavilions, like Clement Park ○ Should be near parking; could be at present parking lot or if flat on top is used, there ○ Firepit, centrally located or several small ones; views ○ Shelter and spectatorship for tennis and skate park ○ Use old skate park
Potential Public Art	Low: 2 Medium: 7 High: 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Including public art in an area like this where there are other active uses ○ Low → Flexible set-ups happening everywhere ○ Partnership with Art for the Mountain Community ○ More exposure ○ Artwork at gateways ○ Good for use at entrance
Potential Restroom/Drinking Fountains	Low: 3 Medium: 3 High: 9	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Consider potential for vandalism when putting in restrooms ○ Skate park needs water fountain ○ Always good to have restrooms and drinking fountains ○ Since recreation center is at same locations, it wouldn't be helpful ○ A few more fountains for human hydration ○ At least 1 restroom ○ Family friendly for full-day activities
Potential Grass Playfield	Low: 8 Medium: 1 High: 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Nice idea, but environmentally "unfriendly" – water needs and maintenance ○ Not here ○ Low: We have the football and soccer fields ○ Acquire Denver Mountain Parks and develop ball field on top ○ "wild" hillside is a great way to develop appreciation for our terrain; leave the green grass at Evergreen High School
Potential Basketball Court	Low: 9 Medium: 0 High: 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ More concrete court to play on ○ Very little interest, not used for partial use, weather dependent

Existing or Potential Amenity	Importance (High-Med-Low)	Ideas for Improvement
Other	Low: 2 Medium: 2 High: 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Any amenities that are unique and speak to what Evergreen is as a community and maintain nature of mountain community ○ Rail park like Ruby Hill; work with Icelantic and Echo ○ High: Ski/Snowboard, Rail Jam, Teen Hangout – the community needs to support the teens with more activities ○ Ski/snowboard and mountain bike course: not necessary; ropes course: dangerous (liability issue); teen hangout: you really believe a park can take them away from the computer screen? ○ Yes: ropes course, nature play, outdoor education; No: mountain bike course; Maybe: ski/snowboard, rail jam, gateways, teen hangout ○ I don't think that snowboard stuff should be combined with Skate Park. Concrete + Ice = BAD! ○ Please include shade/shelter and drinking water at skate park ○ Ropes course may be incorporated into play area with rocks and ropes course or something similar ○ A lot of these would be awesome ○ Allow local food truck/vendor from local restaurants ○ High: adventure ropes course, skateboard competition, food vendor ○ Low: mountain bike course, teen hangout ○ Pump track unnecessary – MTB amenities already exists ○ Ropes course/team building course for recreation center → revenue builder/education ○ “hangout” – proper waste management (SS recycling) ○ dog park: there is already a good park at Elk Meadow
